• No Construction or Landscaping Materials concrete, asphalt, dirt, sod, brick, asbestos, sand, gravel or composition roofing

• No Commercial or Industrial Garbage

• No Air Conditioners, Freezers, Refrigerators, Compressors or other items containing Freon (except as acceptable by the Reuse organizations – see back of flyer)

How much do I pay?

Fees are generally less than the minimums at the landfill, and the location is more convenient. Fees collected in excess of the actual expenses, will be divided equally by North Tabor and Mt. Tabor Neighborhood Associations. Fees will be charged for all items accepted. Neighbors are encouraged to use curbside recycling for appropriate items prior to the event.

General Fees:

\$10-\$15 average loads \$25 large loads \$30 and up for oversize loads

\$5 per tire off rim \$10 per tire on rim

2014 North Tabor/Mt. Tabor Neighborhood Cleanup Event - April 26th

Mt. Tabor and North Tabor Neighborhood Associations team up to offer neighbors the opportunity to responsibly and efficiently dispose of unwanted items. The neighborhood Clean Up coordinators volunteer to organize the event and funds from Southeast Uplift, City of Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability and Metro make the event possible. The goal of the event is to reduce materials flowing to the landfill by recovering, reusing and recycling while creating a sense of community by fostering responsibility and hosting an event that brings neighbors and neighborhoods together.

Know your load! So that your items can quickly get to the right location(s) and speed up your transit time through the stations. Spent/damaged items go to recycling or landfill and good condition items go to the Resale Area/Reuse Collection. Items with remaining useful life will be offered for sale until 12:30 at which time the remaining items will be donated to Community Warehouse, Habitat ReStore, Community Cycling Center, and possibly SE or NE Tool Library.

Recycling collection areas:

-Scrap metals. (please have those items segregated in your load.)

-Large wood debris. (no compost, no dirt, no sod).

-Styrofoam peanuts. (volunteers needed to transport these to UPS on Hawthorne at 1pm) -Electronics and Styrofoam block. (Green Century is collecting at the event)



Materials accepted by Community Warehouse:

SMALL HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES: Toasters, radios, microwaves, toaster ovens, electric fans, telephones, irons/ironing boards, vacuum cleaners, etc.. Does NOT accept stereos. Accepts working microwaves in good, reusable condition. TELEVISIONS: Accepts working televisions, not including consoles. FURNITURE - mattresses & box springs (especially twin and double), bunk beds, dressers, night stands, kitchen tables & chairs, sofas, loveseats, recliners, coffee & end tables, shelves, small desks and lamps. NOTE: Families need twin, double and queen beds. KITCHENWARE - dishes, glasses, pots & pans, silverware, cooking utensils, baking pans & casserole dishes, dish racks, toasters, coffee makers, mixers, and blenders. BASIC HOUSEHOLD ITEMS - linens (sheets, blankets, towels), sleeping pillows, area rugs, framed mirrors, artwork, fans, space heaters, mops, brooms & vacuum cleaners, TVs, radios, alarm clocks, irons, telephones and garbage cans. Community Warehouse WILL NOT ACCEPT console TVs, stereos, water beds, or children's items.

Materials accepted by Community Cycling Center:

Adult road bikes and kids bikes of all sizes. Usable bike parts.

Materials accepted by Habitat for Humanity ReStore:

Doors - excluding hollow core, bi-fold and shower doors, Hardware - All types & fasteners, Carpet: unused, 100sq ft or larger, Linoleum: unused, 25sq ft or larger, Wood & Laminate flooring: full, unopened boxes, Lumber & Siding -5ft or longer, no nails or screws, Sinks & Fixtures - Clean, no chips, cracks or scratches, Roofing - Asphalt, wood, metal, plastic, tar paper, Tile - Never installed, 10 sq ft or larger, Toilets - 1.6 gpf or less, clean, working order with all parts, Windows - Vinyl and wood, undamaged, unfogged, working order, Appliances-Fridges and dishwashers (up to 7 years old), Furnaces, duct, bathroom fans and vents, Lighting & electrical hardware - Light fixtures, new electrical supplies. Tools: Table saws, hammers, power tools, rakes, shovels.

Pre-Clean Up Options:

Working refrigerators and freezers 10 to 30 cu ft for Pacific Power or Portland General Electric customers, may be pick up and possibly incentives for recycling. Call Energy Trust of Oregon, 866-444-8907, for details.

Consider having a yard sale before the cleanup to get rid of useable items you no longer want. Or donate to ARC, Goodwill, Value Village, Community Warehouse, Habitat ReStore, Community Cycling Center or SCRAP.
