1) East Multnomah County "Back to Nature" Conservation Grant

Informational briefing. This grant could give us up to \$10,000 without matching funds for a one year project, or significantly more for a multi-year project with matching funds from other agencies like BPS and PBOT. This money could be used to create a "Back to Nature" walkway from the MAX station east through the Pocket via NE Oregon to connect to Rosemont Bluff. This could include:

- Restoration of Rosemont Bluff
- Educational Displays
- Community garden
- Natural play area

- 3) The Mixed Use Corridors project and the Compressive Plan (Glisan 47<sup>th</sup> to 62<sup>nd</sup> and Burnside 53<sup>rd</sup> to 61<sup>st</sup>.) When the new zoning map takes effect where will CM2 (mixed use, Neighborhood scale) be allowed outright and where are we holding off zoning until later.
- 4) Discussion of the Residential zoning map and our mediated discussion on Nov 17<sup>th</sup> hosted by BPS (Bureau of Planning and Sustainability)
- 5) Following up on NE Halsey, the TGM Grant, the 70's bikeway integration to North Tabor and any concerns YOU may bring.
