Quick Recap: NTNA discussed various neighborhood events, including a candidate forum for city council members and potential community gatherings. They addressed organizational matters such as designing new yard signs, updating their logo, and improving meeting structure. The group also covered local developments, including changes to the city council and upcoming transportation projects.

- **General Discussion, Swifts Migration, Greek Festival, and Block Party Plans:** The meeting focused on the migration of Swifts from Chapman Elementary School to Holy Trinity, with discussions on their timing and the upcoming Greek festival. There were also concerns about a potential development at 58th and Flanders, with some uncertainty about its status. The conversation ended with plans for a block party and a long bike ride. Additionally, NTNA discussed the relocation of a school from Chapman to 30th and Gleason, and the presence of a large number of crows in the area.

- **6:45 New NA Yard Signs**

- NTNA discussed the proposal for new yard signs for the North Tabor Neighborhood Association, with a budget of around \$500 (\$10/sign). The signs were to include a QR code linking to the event's communication products (Link Tree). NTNA also suggested the idea of increasing neighborhood association visibility, particularly with upcoming board elections. The team also discussed the possibility of updating the logo and incorporating it into new designs. The conversation also touched on the unique transportation features of their neighborhood and the need for a logo for the yard signs.
- Potential Slogan: Help shape the future of our neighborhood.
- NTNA voted (unanimously) to establish a committee to design and print 50 yard signs featuring their updated logo and transportation-centric graphics. Ross, Gail, Kim, and Amanda are tasked with this project, which has a \$500 budget. The aim is to create a visually appealing neighborhood identity before the next meeting, with potential reimbursement from Southeast Uplift.

- **7:05 Candidate Forum with Mt Tabor NA**

- NTNA discussed the new 12-member city council with ranked-choice voting for 3 district representatives. They proposed an event to educate voters about the new council's responsibilities and the restructured roles of mayor, city administrator, and council members.
- NTNA planned to draft a letter inviting council candidates to a meeting to discuss the plan and expenses. Four individuals expressed interest in helping with a candidate forum.
